## **Denesuline Barrenground Caribou Management Plan Framework**

WHEREAS	the Prince Albert Grand Council and the Chiefs of the Athabasca region
	express major concerns of the declining population of the Barren-Ground
	Caribou that are currently under consideration to be listed as threatened
	under the Federal Species at Risk Act

- WHEREAS Federal and provincial governments have committed to ensure First Nations involvement in the management and recovery of Barren-Ground Caribou including respect for Treaty, Inherent and Aboriginal rights and Traditional Ecological Knowledge.
- WHEREAS Athabasca Denesuline communities of Hatchet Lake, Black Lake, and Fond du Lac First Nations have been the stewards of the caribou since time immemorial and are most suited to put caribou first and manage them accordingly.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Denesuline Ne Ne Land Corporation identify funding and work with the communities to develop an Athabasca Denesuline specific barrenground caribou management plan framework to address the decline of the populations and to provide traditional and modern solutions in moving forward.
