The negotiation team is happy to report that we are starting to do in-person meetings again about the North of 60 negotiations. When we do any meeting, we continue to follow the latest COVID protocols.

On October 6, in Prince Albert, we brought together the full negotiation team, with representatives from all three communities. We updated the team on the negotiations and talked about what is left to do before the draft agreement is finalized and ready to bring to members for a vote.

More importantly, though, we are ready to get back into communities to meet with our members.

The negotiation team will be heading to all three Athabasca Denesuliné communities in November to share information and answer questions about the North of 60 process. More details will be shared soon on our website, on Facebook and in each community.




Nancy is from Fond Du Lac and currently lives in Prince Albert. She is a mother of 5 and has two grandchildren.
